TERMS & CONDITIONS

TEAMS

Teams must be comprised of 2-4 high school students (9th – 12th grade/form) and one teacher or adult advisor. Advisors must be willing and able to be broadly available and provide assistance to all team members. All team members must be actively enrolled for the duration of the Diamond Challenge and in good academic standing at their respective schools.

ORIGINALITY

Only business and social venture concepts conceived by members of the team may be submitted to the Diamond Challenge. In situations where other, non-participants also played a significant role in creating or developing the concept, team members are expected to have gained non-participants' consent to submit the concept and disclose their names during the registration process.

VENTURE HISTORY

Business and social venture submissions must not have generated more than \$100,000 in total revenue prior to the submission deadline for the written concept.

RULES OVERSIGHT

The Horn Program in Entrepreneurship's Director and Youth Programs Manager shall comprise the Rules Committee for the Diamond Challenge, and serve as final arbiters of all rules, rules clarifications, and otherwise. The Rules Committee reserves the right to disqualify any participants who violate these rules or the spirit of the competition.

DISCLAIMER

The Diamond Challenge includes open session presentations and external review of business concept submissions. Participation is voluntary, and as such, participants are responsible for determining whether to disclose proprietary or sensitive information in their submissions and presentations.
